## MEMORANDUM

**Re:** Urban Forestry Master Plan – Background and Upcoming Progress Update

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide brief background regarding the City of Edgewater's [Urban Forestry Master Plan \(“UFMP”\)](#) and to advise the Sustainability Board that staff will present an implementation progress update at the Board's upcoming meeting of **April 28, 2026**.

In 2023, the City initiated preparation of its first comprehensive Urban Forestry Master Plan to establish a long-range roadmap for the care, preservation, expansion, and management of Edgewater's urban tree canopy. The planning process included technical analysis, public engagement, community surveys, and consultation with stakeholders regarding priorities for trees throughout the city. The final plan was adopted by City Council in 2024 and remains the City's guiding policy document for urban forestry efforts.

The UFMP recognizes that trees provide substantial public benefits, including neighborhood beautification, shade, air quality improvements, stormwater benefits, wildlife habitat, and community resilience. The plan outlines recommendations and action items intended to strengthen tree preservation practices, improve maintenance of public trees, expand planting efforts, build partnerships, and support data-driven management of the urban forest.

As the Sustainability Board also serves as the City's Tree Commission, continued oversight and awareness of plan implementation is important. **Section 4 of the UFMP specifically addresses implementation and the importance of periodically measuring progress over time** to ensure that the City remains accountable to the plan's goals, can adjust priorities as needed, and can identify successes and resource needs. Regular progress reporting is a key component of effective plan implementation.

Accordingly, staff has undertaken an internal inventory of actions completed, actions underway, and future implementation opportunities associated with the UFMP. At the **April 28, 2026 Sustainability Board meeting**, staff will provide a more detailed presentation of findings, including progress toward specific action items, operational accomplishments supporting the plan, and recommended next steps for continued implementation.

This update is intended to support the Board's ongoing role in urban forestry policy guidance and to assist with future communication regarding Edgewater's continued commitment to maintaining and enhancing its urban forest.
